They range from points of view that include believing that there is no such thing as Parental Alienation to other websites who advocate that Parental Alienation occurs in every situation in which a father does not have custody of the child or children of the relationship. The following information is based on research and clinical experience. I believe that it accurately reflects what is currently known about Parental Alienation. If you believe that you are currently in a Parental Alienation situation, I encourage you to have a complete Custody and Access/Section 15 Assessment completed by a psychologist knowledgeable about this phenomena.
